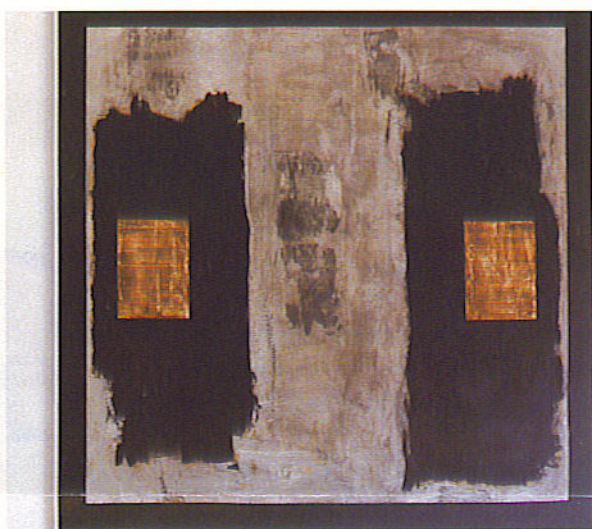




### scandinavia to san diego

DNA Gallery is the creation of Danish architect Jesper Pedersen and wife, Cathi, recent arrivals from Denmark. They are importing the classic upper crust of Danish, Swedish and Finnish furniture, lamps and accessories by some of Scandinavia's top architects and designers. Poul Henningsen, Poul Kjaerholm, Alvar Aalto, Verner Panton and Arne Jacobsen — names familiar to anyone who monitors mid-century or contemporary design — are well represented. In addition you'll see paintings by a Copenhagen artist, glass items by a Scandinavian glass blower and items by other talents new to our town. DNA Gallery is in the Cedros Design District.



**tip:** Get a good book on mid-century design and learn the who's who in Scandinavian design. You can find *Mid-Century Modern: Furniture of the 1950s* by Cara Greenberg in paperback from Harmony Books, while Taschen offers *Decorative Arts 1950s* by Charlotte and Peter Fiell.
